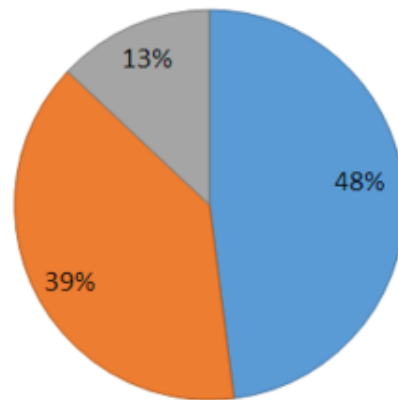

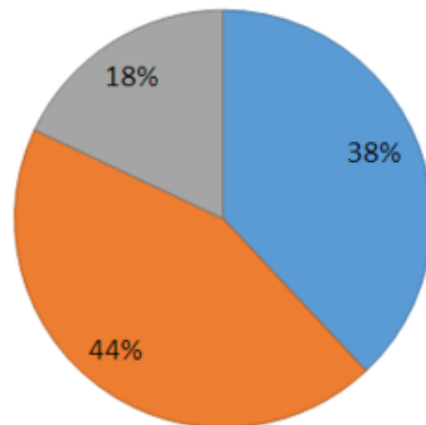
Three quarters of DESPs allow Senior Graders to do ROG, and nationally they're responsible for around half of all Referral Outcome Grading.

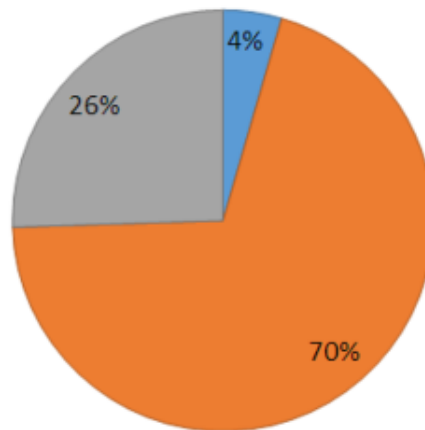

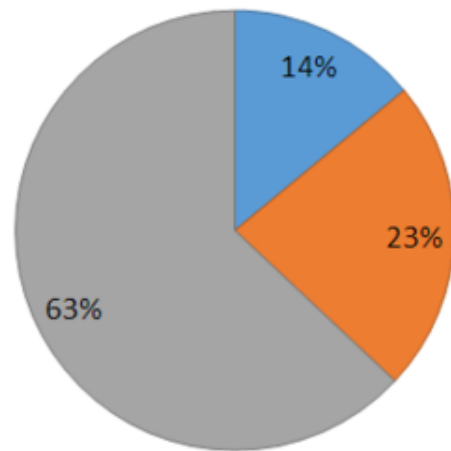
Where OCT is used as part of DS, only 4% of OCT scan interpretation is carried out by Senior Graders.

A third of DESPs have trained Senior Graders to do SLB, but nationally they're only responsible for 14% of Slit Lamp examinations.

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



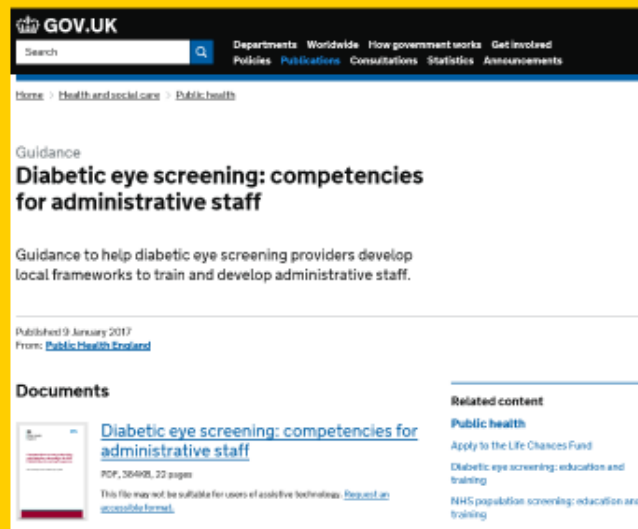
